What is Lay Pastoral Care?

Caring Companions are volunteers from our congregation and are selected, trained, and supervised by our BUU Minister and commissioned by the Congregation.

Team members serve as an extension of our BUU Minister. They are trained in compassionate listening and caring presence.

Associates are available for those who would welcome a visit or for those who are experiencing difficult circumstances or times of transition and could use some <u>confidential</u> on-going support.
